The World Families Australia Office will be closed from Tuesday 16th of December 2025 to Tuesday 6th January 2026 for the Christmas, New Years holiday.

Wishing all our donors and sponsors a safe and happy holiday season. WFA thanks you all for your care and commitment to enriching the lives of those in need across the seas. As a reminder, WFA is a secular organization and is not religiously affiliated. Some of our overseas Project Partners can be faith based, but Australian charity laws are very clear that our funds must not be used for proselytizing nor to discriminate or privilege people from a specific faith. We would like to take this opportunity to thank Tyndale Christian School for their generosity in providing our office space in a very favorable arrangement for WFA. Some of the staff are Project Officers for the Kenyan Projects, but WFA is not an entity of Tyndale School.

President's report - 2025

In 2025 many generous donors continued to fund international projects through World Families Australia. Our donor numbers have continued to fall creating challenges for the future sustainability of the organisation. This year addressing a financial shortfall has only been partially successful. The best solution would be to recruit more donors which to date we have struggled to do.

Projects have continued to be managed over the year by our Project Officers. We have introduced the requirement that all staff and project officers within World Families Australia have a Working with Children Check. Heather has established a database to ensure everyone's Working with Children Check continues to be current. One Ethiopian project is in the process of closing while another one is being developed. Another project in Kenya is also in the development phase. There have been some changes to project officers. Michelle Nethery has resigned and Trevor Anderson has taken over her project in Jimma. Anna Szava has taken over the

Bonga Feeding Centre project from Christine Hoffman and Kerry Walker. Dee Hudson ceased her role with the organisation when the Meskele Kristos project was flagged to be closed.

In this last 12 months we have reviewed all project agreements for currency and relevance. A database has been constructed to ensure the review of all agreements is timely going forward. Some projects have received increased scrutiny around reporting following the tri-annual review. In addition, we recently revised our approach to reporting expectations. Ongoing monitoring will continue of all our projects to ensure they comply with government and other legal requirements.

Di Amato resigned as newsletter editor this year but will remain with the organisation as a highly valued advisor. Di has been with the organisation since early days and her knowledge is unsurpassed. Thank you Di for all your years of service to the organisation.

A new newsletter editor will be joining us in the New Year – thank you Carolyn MacLulich for taking on the role. Very much appreciated.

Over the last 12 months Heather Douglas has settled into her role as Office Manager and I cannot thank her enough for all the work she has done and continues to do. Among other things Heather has taken on updating the website, Project Officers Handbook and kept the newsletter going until our new replacement newsletter editor comes on board. She has also been developing an office management manual. Thank you Heather!

Kerry Walker and Robyn Merritt continue to manage the finances with skill and accountability. Kerry also produces clear, comprehensive reports for Trevor Anderson, our Treasurer, and the Management Committee. Thank you Kerry, Robyn and Trevor.

Once again, I would like to thank everyone for their support over the last twelve months. The donors for providing funds to the projects, the office staff and office bearers, for ensuring the organisation runs smoothly, and the project officers.

Minjur Home Project

Minjur Home is a shelter home for school aged girls up to 18 years of age who have been rescued from situations of severe poverty, neglect, homelessness. They study at primary and secondary school under the guidance of the Seva Missionary Sisters of Mary at Minjur in the city of Chennai, Tamil Nadu, India.

We are seeking donations to enable five (5) students to complete their studies for the **Diploma of Nursing** at the Seva Rural Community College. A year ago, donations received paid their First-Year enrolment fees. The Second-Year enrolment fees have yet to be paid \$A615 per student for this two- year course.

The course will help the girls overcome the cycle of poverty and gain skills for a brighter future. Empower them to make right decisions in their life. Develop self-confidence and self-esteem. Offering a safe and supportive environment away from exploitation and abuse. Help them develop leadership skills, communication and problem-solving skills. Economic independence and self-sufficiency. Restoring hope and provide better job opportunities. Assisting them to overcome past traumas and challenging what had happened in their childhood.


